ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING REPORT

On Sunday, November 17, the congregation approved the 2024 financial report-to-date, 2024 committee reports, Consistory's actions on the congregation's behalf in the past year, and the 2025 proposed budget. Mikey McCormick and Carole Lee were elected to fill elder's terms. Rebecca Hillje, Penny Shade and Darren Walbridge were re-elected as deacons and Todd Roberts was elected to serve as a deacon. Harris Bradley, Terri Luckenbill, Lora Yoder, and Peggy Zechman will continue to serve on Consistory. Thanks are extended to Brian Fred Edling and Keith Edling who have completed many years of service, and to Carrie Ann Klinger, Kenny Klinger, and Rusty Searle who resigned earlier in the year.

The congregation also voted to resume normal limit of terms for Consistory members up to three consecutive terms. Terms were changed from three years to two years. In early 2025, the congregation will submit recommendations for proposed recipients of the 2024 Kline Fund Tithe, to be selected on Sunday, February 16, at the 2025 Annual Financial Meeting.

At the reorganizational meeting following the congregational meeting, Consistory elected Penny Shade to serve as President, Harris Bradley to continue as Vice President, and Lora Yoder to serve as secretary.

PROPERTY UPDATES

Boiler Fund Update

In October 2019, when we needed to replace the very old boiler, the congregation decided we would buy it ourselves, rather than utilizing the Kline Fund. While the initial payment was borrowed from the Kline Fund, we are working to reimburse it. To date, we have repaid \$10,282 of the \$37,000 expense. Consistory proposes that we work to repay this debt in 2025.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program

This government program, known as LIHEAP, helps low-income families pay their heating bills. (Unfortunately, it does not cover propane.) From November 4, 2024, to April 4, 2025, you can apply for a cash grant to help pay your heating bill, receiving from \$200 to \$1,000 based on your household. The grant is a one-time payment sent directly to your utility provider or fuel company to be credited on your bill.
